We have updated the online safety section of our school website with several new useful parent guides.



## READING OUT OF SCHOOL







One of our school improvement targets this year is to; raise outcomes for all children in reading, with a particular focus on further developing their ability to write more detailed answers when responding to inference type questions so that a greater % of them reach the expected standard and above in reading by the end of the year in all year groups.

Our school improvement plan for parents for 2018-19 can now be found on our school website under the key information tab. In the plan we have outlined how parents and carers can support us in these aims. For reading;

- Hear your children read regularly out of school (three times a week) and record this in their reading records for us.
- Ask questions about the story: who the characters are, what the story tells the reader about their personalities, where the story is set, what is happening in the story, what might happen next and why they think that.
- Visit the class pages on our website to familiarise yourself with the key objectives that your child should be learning for each year group in reading.
- Visit our school website to find the top 100 books to read before you leave primary school.

- In EYFS and KS1 classes support your child with any phonics activities sent home weekly.
- Be a good role-model and read a wide range of texts yourself.
- Read a bed-time story to your children.
- With younger children share nursery rhymes, songs and traditional stories.
- Talk about the sounds, words and letters you see when you are out and about.
- Use expression and intonation when you are reading aloud to your children.
- Read in a special/comfortable place which your child likes or chooses.
- Ask your child what their 'word of the week' is for English and discuss all the other types of words that mean the same thing.

# (Synonyms)-Big

- Ask your child about more complex vocabulary in the story and explain the vocabulary (or help them use a dictionary to find out)
- When rewarding your children out of school, treat them to a brand new reading book as an alternative to a brand new computer game/clothing/sweets.










Please make every effort to refrain from parking in the designated areas which include;

- Anywhere on the yellow zig-zag lines which includes dropping off and collecting.

- Opposite the school field on the bend on Juniper Road as this obstructs through traffic.
- Across the entrance / driveway of any local residents' properties.

- Stay off the pavement

Many thanks to the vast majority of parents who continue to support our safe parking initiative. Unfortunately, there are still a small number of parents who continue to park where cones are placed and on bends. Please make every effort not to do so and <u>under NO</u> circumstances ever park across the dropped kerb oppositve the school, as this is the ONLY safe place for our children to cross the road.
