

"My favourite pose was the tree pose because you could stay still or sway if you wanted to." Sean.


"It was really relaxing." Issy P.

2019 KS2 Results

Congratulations on your Key Stage 2 test results for 2019.

My colleague, the School's Minister Nick Glbb MP shared the results with me and it was encouraging to see that Boreham Primary has realised a higher proportion of pupils achieving the expected standard in reading writing and maths, as reflected in the rise from 57% in 2018 to 81% in 2019.

I would like to extend my thanks to the teachers, staff and pupils for this achievement. The national average results this year was 65%, bring England's primary schools in line with the best in world.

I have been fortunate to visit and work with many of the schools across the constituency and successfully lobbied the government on increasing per pupil funding, which means an increase for all schools in our area.

I will resume my role as Children's Minister once I return from maternity leave, so if there are any issues you would like to raise with please do let me know.

Once again, congratulations, It's a fantastic result for all involved.
