

Please make every effort to refrain from parking in the designated areas which include;


- Anywhere on the yellow zig-zag lines which includes dropping off and collecting.
- The bends on either side of our school car-park.
- Across the dropped kerb opposite the main school gates which is the only safe place for pedestrians to cross.
- Directly opposite the school on the either side of the bend that leads to a residential carparking area.
- Opposite the school field on the bend on Juniper Road as this obstructs through traffic.
- Across the entrance / driveway of any local residents' properties.

Councillor Philip Wilson, Boreham & The Leighs Ward, was in attendance at the school on Monday and Friday morning and had this to say.

"Our children's safety at school drop off and pick up times is of paramount importance. More cars than ever are doing the school run hence there being more traffic and as a result, more hurry and more impatience. This inevitably leads to potentially hazardous situations on the roads outside our school and while serious incidents have thankfully been averted, we want it to stay that way.

By parking a safe distance from the school and walking the last bit, not only are you getting a bit of exercise, but you are also reducing the congestion outside the school gates. I'd appeal to everyone to help Mr Bowyer, his staff and the children at the school to make this project a success."
