All of the children have also had the opportunity to meet their new class teacher, with each teacher handing out an 'All About Me' profile to the children too.

As we come to the end of what has been the most strangest and turbulent academic year I have ever known in 22 years of working in education, we say goodbye to several members of staff at Boreham. Firstly, Mrs Boshell who will be relocating to East Sussex. Mrs Boshell has been with us at Boreham for 5 years as an extremely loyal, popular and hardworking member of our teaching staff. Secondly, Mr Lee will also be leaving us to take up a new position at High Ongar Primary School. Although Mr Lee has only been with us for one year, he has brought much to our school in this time, not least in computing. He too, has been a very popular member of staff, proving to be a great team player. Miss Gladwell, one of our learning support assistants, will also be leaving after spending two years with us. Miss Gladwell has been successful in gaining a university place in order to become a trainee speech and language therapist. We wish all three members of staff every happiness and very best wishes for their future.

We will also be really pleased to see Mrs Hutley back in school in September and I know she has greatly appreciated all of your kind words of support.

On Monday I will be sending out to you full details of our September re-opening so that you have all of the necessary information for your child's return to school in September. Obviously, any plans will be subject to change and dependent upon the local and national picture. As a school, we are also putting together comprehensive plans in the event of a 'local lockdown' / partial / full school closure.

Over the last few days I have started to take some time to reflect upon these past few months. Back in September 2019 when we commenced this academic year, who could have possibly thought what would follow! Since the end of March we have all had to adjust to a new way of living and learn to adapt to living day by day, unable to make any firm plans, due to the constant changes which has caused us all huge anxiety and much fear. Using and abiding by new terminology such as; 'social distancing', 'lockdown', 'keyworker', 'bubbles' has become the new norm and part of everyday life. In school, we have had to learn a completely new way of educating our children with so many restrictions

upon us. Many of our staff have had to teach groups of children (keyworker children) across a vast range of year groups within the school hall, which is completely different to teaching one year group within a classroom setting.

As parents, you have just been <u>absolutely</u> amazing! You all had to become teachers overnight, delivering daily lessons to your children, whilst holding down your own jobs, caring for younger siblings and maintaining the family home, whilst coping with your own fears and anxieties, without the close support of extended family members and close friends. You have helped us <u>so much</u> as a school in preparing your children for their return to school and I cannot thank you all enough for the kind words of support, emails, cakes and other treats that you have been sending in for staff! You must all be extremely exhausted now and I do hope that you will all take some well-deserved time to rest and recuperate during the summer holidays.

As this crazy year ends, I would like to pay <u>huge</u> thanks to all of the staff at Boreham Primary School who have pulled together <u>magnificently</u> as a team over the past 4 months to ensure a smooth running as possible of the school. Many of my staff gave up time within their Easter and May half term holidays (unpaid) to provide care and provision for our keyworker children as well as juggling their own issues with childcare arrangements.

Finally, to the children. Well, what can I say? The children have all coped **remarkably** well, not least our keyworker children, who have been attending school since the end of March. To all of our children who returned to school in Years 1 and 6 and Reception Class in June, you have been equally amazing too! The behaviour of all of our children has been quite **outstanding** and they have certainly given all of the staff at Boreham a much needed lift during a dark period of time.

When we return in September, we will be much stronger as a community and we will be more prepared and equipped than ever, to deal with any changes that are imposed on us together. For now, enjoy the six weeks holidays with your families, stay safe and well and see you all again in September!

AN END OF YEAR MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR OF GOVERNORS

Dear Parent / Carers

This has certainly been a very difficult and unusual time for us all. The initial self-isolation and the inability to see our friends followed by the slow creep back to normality has proven troublesome enough for adults, but how strange and perplexing this must be for children. Those who have returned have been exemplary in their behaviour and in following the rules. They can probably teach us a great deal about distancing, routines and maintaining a positive, cheerful demeanour in the face of You, as parents, have probably adversity. discovered more about your children over the past three months than you would normally and that will include what they can and cannot do at school. Some of you will have relished the home schooling, but I am assuming that most of you would prefer your children back at school. SUMMER HOLIDAY WORKS

During the summer holiday break we have some planned premises work taking place. Firstly, the exterior of our demountable classroom will have some much needed repair work carried out to it. Secondly, to ensure that our children and staff can access our all-weather daily mile track all year round, we are having an extension to the track. The extension will begin at the end of our junior playground in-between our iunior trim-trail and swimming loog toilets/changing room outbuilding and join up to part of the existing track on the field. This will ensure a much safer access to the field and track.

We are also going to be having some further works carried out to the base of our new Biodome which we have been unable to use since it was erected in February. We have every intention of opening up this fantastic outdoor learning space from September onwards.

Finally, after many years, our historic wooden pirate ship located on our junior playground will be dismantled. In its place will be a brand new dance/acting performance stage with 4 benches for an audience. This new facility will ensure that if we are unable to sing indoors, we will have a designated area outside where children can express themselves. The new stage will also be a facility that our classes will be able to use to film class assemblies and performances for you, whilst you are unable to come onto the school premises.
