#### BOREHAM BIO-DOME

Despite dreadful weather conditions during the installation week and over half term, the team worked with such diligence to successfully erect our amazing new bio-dome! Two surveys were sent out to gain the views of our local community and children. We had 238 responses from the Facebook survey sent out and both extremely positive surveys were recognised the benefits of the bio-dome. The lead for the Local Authority, Essex Finance Support Team and members of Boreham's Parish Council also welcomed the bio-dome and believe that it was great kudos for the school and will put our school on the map! Some local schools have already made contact with us, expressing an interest to visit the bio-dome.

Unfortunately due to mechanical issues, the bio-dome has yet to be fully completed but we anticipate that this will be all rectified very soon. We will plan to organise an official opening during the latter part of the summer term.

BBC Essex are visiting the school on 11<sup>th</sup> March to film children taking part in a Science lesson and to talk to Mrs Chalk (Science Subject Lead) and I about our brand new bio-dome.

During half term I was also delighted to hear that our application to the Tesco Bags of Help grant scheme had been successful and our project will be put forward to a customer vote in Tesco stores during April, May and June 2020. Our project, along with the other two successful projects in the region, will go forward to a vote in Tesco stores where their customers will decide the outcome by voting for their favourite project each time they shop. Voting will take place from Wednesday 1 April 2020 to Tuesday 30 June 2020. The project with the highest number of votes will receive £2,000, the second placed project £1,000 and the third placed project £500 (or the amount that was requested up to these values). We will be notified at the end of July 2020 confirming the amount of funding we will receive.

### English Seesaw Page - Share A Story £5 Voucher Competition!

How to upload your entries onto our English Seesaw Page

Children are already familiar with the uploading process and sharing work to the English page is very similar to the way many children are already doing so on the Science Seesaw page via the Seesaw Learning Journal App. Children use this process frequently in school, but it is also stated below:

To upload your 'Share A Story' challenges onto the English Seesaw page you will need to:

- 1) Download the **Seesaw: the learning journal app** (This is a different app to the family Seesaw app)
- 2) Click 'I'm a student'
- 3) Scan the QR code below
- 4) Click 'activities' at the bottom of the page and then 'add' to the activity name
- 5) Select the correct year group
- 6) Upload your 'Share A Story' challenge by taking a photo, completing a drawing or adding some written information. Please remember to upload your name
- 7) Click the green tick button in the top right hand corner
- 8) Wait for your work to be approved by a teacher

## EX PREMIERSHIP FOOTBALLER VISITS BOREHAM

Ex-Premiership striker, Leroy Lita visited our school on Wednesday to help deliver mini football sessions for our Year 4 and 6 classes. Leroy is currently playing for Chelmsford City FC and was ably supported by Luke Owers and Phil Hopkins.

Born 28 December 1984, Leroy is a former professional footballer who currently plays for National League South club Chelmsford City. Lita was a product of the Chelsea youth system but never made a first-team appearance for the club; in 2002, he moved to Bristol City and later represented Reading, where his form helped him earn a place with the England under-21 side. He later played for Swansea City, Barnsley, Yeovil Town, in Greece for AO Chania and in Thailand for Sisaket, with loan spells at Charlton Athletic, Norwich City, Birmingham City, Sheffield Wednesday, Brighton & Hove Albion and Notts County. He then moved into non-league football with Margate and Salisbury while coaching at Haverhill Rovers
