#### GARDENING CLUB

This week, my group harvested plenty of elderflower blossoms from outside of the Year 5 classroom and then we took them to the family room to start making it into cordial. The children were shown how to zest/juice lemons and wash the elderflowers after taking off the stalks. We made a simple syrup by boiling water and sugar together, Ed was chief stirrer! I taught them to use the crab/claw method to hold the lemon while they cut it in half, ensuring fingers were well out of the way of the knife. We mixed everything together and left it to infuse. The children said how wonderful it smelt and are looking forward to sampling it next week at our last session.

Lynn's group planted out some wildflowers they had planted several weeks ago which have been growing steadily in Lynn's greenhouse. They have created a wildflower bank in front of the spectacular poppies which are flowering in the allotment at the moment. They also planted some Giant Russian Sunflowers which Mrs Powell had secured as part of a competition with Hallway Promotions company.

To finish with we all went and had a look at the produce growing in the Bio-dome. The children tried a few strawberries each and were amazed at the growth of the cucumbers and squashes but we didn't hang around as it was 46 degrees in there!
