- Susan the Dragon!


Who do the bones belong to?

Our Year 5 class have had a very exciting Dragons week too.







DRAGONS WEEK

Class 2D have had a fun action packed dragons week! In maths, the class have looked at measuring lengths and heights of various dragons, comparing different wing spans of dragons. The children measured their own arm span too. The class enjoyed building their own dragons and in computing created dragon stories using puppet pals. In History the class learnt the story of St George and the Dragon and in their English lessons they have learnt about different dragons ready to write an information text.



It's been a really exciting and fun week! Thank you to all of the teachers for planning a great Dragons week!



Year 2E measured dragons, had a fire breathing competition which they measured in metres outside, designed their own dragons and then built them using a range of constructions materials.



Our Year 1 class have had an exciting Dragons week too. The children completed dragon maths work and in Geography used the map of the UK to place dragons on. The class also wrote a short story about a dragon and used coloured paper to make dragon mosaics.

PARENT AND TEACHER COMMUNICATION

We appreciate that from time to time that you will need to communicate with your child's class teacher. However, we have recently noticed that an increasing number of adults are asking to speak to the class teacher at 8:50am and in some cases even walking into the classrooms.

Whilst we continue to operate an open door school policy, may I remind all parents, that other than school staff, no other adults unless given permission to do so, should be entering any classroom either before or after school for safeguarding reasons. It is also extremely difficult for class teachers to speak to parents about any concerns in detail when they have responsibility for a whole class of children and registration to be completed by 9am. Many of our classes also have additional adults working within the classroom too, but these adults are there to primarily support the children with their learning first thing in the morning.

If you do need to communicate with your child's class teacher, can we remind you that there are always a number of staff on duty before and after school or alternatively make an appointment to see your child's class teacher via the main school office.
